I declare my candidacy for President of the ICO

I wished some member to announce one's candidacy in vain. As absence of ICO President is undesirable, today (JUN 1, 2022) I announce my candidacy for the first President of the ICO (International Conciliation Organization).

I am President of the ELFO, so every day I am very busy, in addition I am very old, 80 years old now. These are main reasons why wanted some other member to to be an ICO leader. If a wise member appears before us, I am always ready to give my seat to such a great courageous person.

It is conventional to express one's political opinion when one declares candidacy, so I want to express my opinion regarding this new international organization ICO.

1. The ICO must be a source of HOPEs

Our ICO as well as the ELFO must be always and everywhere a source of HOPRs for human beings. Human beings do both good conduct and bad deed. In these grey and rainy days, let us both ICO and ELFO march along peaceful and harmonious way,

For love, not hatred; by construction, not destruction; not dividing, but uniting people's hearts warmly.

2. See people's distress

See people's sadness and unhappiness caused artificially by human work, which leads to many conflicts and even to war. In our heart we cannot be calm. Let us both ICO and the ELFO refrain from deeds which would increase people's anguish.

Remebering people's distress, hoping recovery, to all wishing happiness, health, success and calm family (Earth-Loving Song), let's go with kind heart.

3. Life and Happiness are the first

Human beings are injuring or killing each other with or without justicification. In any conflict the disputing parties may settle it reasonably and peacefully if they are ready to compromise on the basis of respect of peaceful settlement as stipulated

by UN Charter, Art. 33 or in accordance with equity and goodness (ex aequo et bono). Common sense demands mutual compromise, ceasefire and conclusion of peace traty, neither mutual destruction nor killing precious lives.

4.Dangerous Escalation of Russo-Ulrainian War

If Russia and Ukraine continue war, and NATO supports Ukrainiane militarily, the world situation will be darker and darker, it may be possible that war may escalate into Ukrainian attacks of Russian territories (or even Moscow), anyway it is clear that more horrible destruction and loss of countless lives will be caused by such military choice.

4. Impartial and equitable approach

Both the ICO and the the ICCRUW must try to find peaceful settlement of a conflict or belligerency through impartial and equitable approach which means that a party compromises in some fields, and instead of them, the other party also compromises in some other sectors equitably and harmoniously.

5. Win and Win, not one belligerent's surrender

The ICCRUW should present to both of the belligerents such proposals by which two parties may not feel complete defeat. So that the ICCRUW should avoid proposal to be sent to one of belligerents, by which the ICCRUW recommends to surrender in the present war.

6. Do States join the ICO?

It is very desirable that States accede to the ICO, it is possible that some States or VIPs join the ICO, seeing its reasonaleness. We can see a few of VIPs try to conciliate between belilgerents separarely and sponteanously. I want States of neutral character to unite organizationally. Now we, let us ICO and the ICCRUW try to do effective friendly conciliatory activities more systematically.

Together the ICCRUW will be stronger!! Please feel free to recommend oneself as ICO Chair, ICCRUW President and Chair

These 3 posts are also very important. At present time there is no candidate. There are several members ready to go to Russia and Ukraine. I hope that at least 2 candidate appear from among them.

Belligerents & their allies should not join conciliation commission

I found some points in the old rules of conciliation which are desirable to correct. One of them is Powers' (strong States) involvement in conciliation.

In the beginning I presented my draft Rules of the ICCRUW where belligerents Russia and Ukraine were precluded from becoming a member of the Inernational Conciliation Commission, which was to be composed of States or pesons of comparatively neutral character. In this regad a Brazilian ELFO member Felipe Marciano commemted as follows (2022/05/15):

My name is Felipe and I'm from Brazil.

I think that this discuss about the war between Russia and Ukraine is not only about the two countries, I think it's necessary to talk to other nations envolved like the U.S.A for example, this country have an important weight on the reasons for the war, and for a more peaceful planet earth, it's necessary to talk to the important leaders from this powerfull country as well.

They are envolved in so much wars... For a peaceful earth it's necessary to envolve all nations and explore the deep reasons of the war, It'll be really eficient to solve the reasons of the war, and not simplely the war...

Sincerely Felipe!

Soon I sent him a reply which read , among others, as follows (20225/23) :

So far as the ICCRUW (International Conciliation Commission) is concerned, however, I hope you will agree to the Rules of the ICCRUW which was adopted the other day by the GA with

overwhelming majority but you. It is generally recognized conciliatory principle that conflicting parties and their closely interested persons, for example, relatives, are not competent to be a member of a conciliation commission. USA is as if the State were Ukrainian relatives. So Dear Felipe, I am pleased if you can agree to the aforementioned Rules of the ICCRUW. If you cannot agree to the Rules, will you please tell me exactly what provision you don't agree.



An ELFO member Alain Nkongnenwi (pic.) commented on Mr. Felipe's opinion, among others, as follows (2022/5/23):

I will start by asking some very simple questions. If you have two kids fighting and someone says "kid-X" is fighting with "kid-Y" maybe because of kid-X relationship with another "kid-A". Will the best approach to handle such problem be to consult both your kids first hand so as to get the facts or to act based on the assumption made by a third party? Do we really think if we work based on what has been stated by some media outlets as the problem and solution will lead us to the objective of our visit?

My point here is simple, for this dispute/war to be resolved, we don't have to start handling the situation based on assumptions we make. Secondly, One can never really resolve a problem without hearing firstly from the parties involved and if both parties problem statement and reason for the war is related to another country, then we can get the third party involved so as to hear their version. On the other hand, I agree to the fact that, closely related or affected individuals at this stage shouldn't be part of the reconciliation team.

If conflicting parties and some person much interested in the dispute join a conciliation committee, it is very probable that immediately there appear vehement dispute and disorder in the commission which would be beyond our ability. Please recommend oneself

We welcome Powers in the ICO

Dear Felipe Marciano and ICO members

Here are 2 points added to our conciliation rules A ann B.

A. As conciliation seems not always to be conducted by neutral persons, I took into account Mr. Felipe's opinion, presenting the following

6. If necessary, the General Meeting of the ICCRUW may recognize a State, an organization or an individual as a temporal member or consultant.

Thus the USA or NATO countries may involve in the ICCRUW.

B. On the other hand, the ICO is far more general entity than the ICCRUR. I elucidated this legal aspect in the new Art. 3 which reads as follows;

Art. 3. Membership

1. Membership in the Organization is open to all the States which accept the obligation contained in the present Charter.

Together neutral conciliation will be stronger

Anyway yesterday (May 30, 2022) at 20:00 a little bit of correction of ICO Charter and ICCRUW Rules was adopted by ELFO GA (and all the ICO members unanimously).

Next steps are:

- 1. to conduct election of Leaders
- 2. to formulate contents of conciliation
- 3. to invite State, VIPs, Diplomats, and other persons to join the ICO and ICCRUW
- 4. to send Peace and Amity Delegation for Conciliation (PADC)

These works are very hard. I expect your cooperation as much as you can.

ICO Charter

An original draft Charter has been sometimes amended. Now you see the present ICO Charter:.

Charter of the General International Conciliation Organization

Recognizing that conciliation is one of the peaceful means of settling international conflicts as provided for in the UN Charter, Art. 33,

Wishing that the present Charter of the International Conciliation Organization (hereinafter reffered as ICO or Organization) and we its Members help conflicting parties or belligerents mitigate distress and tension by our conciliation and other friendly proposals.

The ELFO (Earth-Loving Friendly Organization) adopted unanimously the present Charter of the General International Conciliation Organization in May 17, 2022.

Art. 1. Purposes

- 1. To contribute to development of friendly relations among nations and
 - **2.** To contribute to maintaining peace and peaceful settlement of conflicts and belligerency through conciliation;

Art.2. Principles

Our Organization and Members shall act in accordance with the following Principles.

- 1. Members shall fulfill in good faith the obligations assumed by them in accordance with the present Charter of the General International Conciliation Organization. (hereinafter referred to as the ICO or Organization)
 - 2. This Organization shall not intervene in

matters which are within the domestic jurisdiction of any State.

- **3.** Our Organization is based on the principle of equality among the same category of its Members.
- 4. The Organization shall try to find neutral equitable conditions to which conflicting parties or belligerents are most likely to agree.

Art. 3. Membership

- 1. Membership in the Organization is open to all the States which accept the obligation contained in the present Charter.
- 2. All the VIPs and Diplomats, who were ELFO members before May 17, 2022, shall be original members of the Organization, and try to find measures which both conflicting or belligerent paties would agree to.

Art. 4. Composition of a conciliation commission

- 1. A conciliation commission shall be composed of States of comparatively neutral character; the States trying to conciliate between belligerents; and their Diplomats.
 - 2. The following States may be a member:
 - a. A neutral State by its policy or by a treaty;
 - b. A State which is demilitarized or has not force;
 - c. A nonaligned State.
- 3. All the VIPs and Diplomats, who were ELFO members, shall be original members of the Organization, and try to find measures which both conflicting or belligerent paties would agree to.
- 4. The United Nations and any other organization conducive to conciliation may be a member of the Organization,
- 5. The ELFO of all humankind character, as an initiator of creation of the Organization, has the exceptional status as an original Member of the Organization.
- 6. If necessary, the General Assembly of the Organization may recognize a State, an organization or an individual as a temporal member or consultant.

Art. 5. Principal organs

There are established as the principal organs of the present Organization, a President, a Chairperson, a General Assembly, a Council and a Secretariat.

Art. 6. A President and a Chairperson

- 1. President represents the Organization externaly, may negotiate with conflicting parties or belligerents.
- 2. A Chairperson presides General Assembly, and in accordance with its decisions may decide internal and external matters.

Art. 7. General Assembly

- 1. The General Assembly is composed of all the Members of the Organization.
- **2.** The main functions of the General Assembly include the following matters:
 - **a.** to deliberate and adopt a draft PROPOSAL on conciliation to be sent to the conflicting or billegerent parties;
 - **b**. to propose them such steps as may mitigate tension between them;
 - c. to elect President and a Charpersons;
 - d. to deliberate and decide the budget of the Organization, provided that a State which PPP (purchasing power parity) is lower than 33% will be freed from membership fee."

Art. 8. The Council

- 1. There will be established a Council composed of less than 20 members.
- 2. Less than 7 members may be members of the Council for five years. The other members may be selected for a certain period concerning a given conflict or belligerency.
- 3. Principal function of the Council is to present to the General Assembly a draft conciliation PROPOSAL to be sent to the conflicting parties or belligerents.

Art.9. Secretariat

- 1. Chairperson may appoint staffs of the Secretariat.
- 2. The Secretary-General shall act in that capacity in the Organization, and perform such other functions as are entrusted to him by these organs.
- 3. Each Member undertakes to respect the exclusively international responsibilities of the Secretary-General and the staff.

Art. 10. Decision

1. A declaration of intention of the Organization its members, the General Assembly and meeting may be conducted, in principle, by the Internet, televisions, e-mails, faxes and so forth.

- **2.** A decision of the Principal organs and the other subsidiary organs shall be adopted by affirmative votes of majority of members present.
- 3. So long as a member-VIP or a member-Diplomat does not express yes or no, his or her Representative by ELFO Charter, Art. 8 shall be regarded a mandatory, and his or her yes or no shall also regarded as the same with that of Representative by the ELFO Charter.

Art. 11. The right to vote

- **1.** a State has bellow-mentioned right to vote, ratio of its population being taken into account;
 - i 80 votes are given to a State with more than 1,000,000,000;
 - ii 70 votes are given to a State with the population from 100,000,000,000 to less than 1,000,000,000;
 - iii 60 votes are given to a State with the population from 10,000,000 to 100,000,000.
 - iv 50 votes are given to a State with population from 1,000,000 to less than 10,000, 000;
 - v 40 votes are given to a State with the population from 100,000 to less than 1,000,000;
 - vi 30 votes are given to a State with the population from 10,000 to less than 100,000;
 - vii 20 votes are given to a State with the population from 1,000 to less than 10,000;
 - viii 10 votes are given to a State with the population less than 1,000.
 - 2. 80 votes are given to President of the ELFO, taking into account its all humankind character.
 - 3. While an eligible State does not send its representative, an ELFO Diplomat from the country may become a member of the Organization with 20% of votes of the State, each additional member will increase 20%. (so 5 compatriot-diplomats have the same votes with their State.)

Art. 12. Beginning of Conciliatory Activities

Even if no State accedes to the Organization, it may begin conciliatory activities together with the original member ELFO.

Art. 13. All National Conciliation Conference

The Organization encourages creation of special individual Conciliation Commission (CC) and All National Conciliation Conference to support the CC as for serious conflicts.

N.B.1. Immedately after the effectuation of the present Rules, our ELFO is ready to talk about revision of the Rules.

N.B.2. Provisionally our ELFO is ready to be the Secretariat of the Organization.

Rules of the ICCRUW

Rules of the International Conciliation Commission on Russo-Ukrainian War

Recognizing that conciliation is one of the peaceful means of settling international conflicts as provided for in the UN Charter, Art. 33,

Wishing that the present Rules of the International Conciliation Commission on Russo-Ukrainian War (hereinafter referred to as ICCRUW) and we its Members help belligerents mitigate distress and tension by our conciliation and other friendly proposals.

The ELFO (Earth-Loving Friendly Organization) adopted unanimously the present Rules of the ICCRUW in April 26, 2022.

Art. 1. Purposes

- 1. To contribute to development of friendly relations among nations and
 - **2.** To contribute to maintaining peace and peaceful settlement of conflicts through conciliation;

Art.2. Principles

Our ICCRUW and its Members shall act in accordance with the following Principles.

- 1. Members shall fulfill in good faith the obligations assumed by them in accordance with the present Rules of the ICCRUW.
- **2.** This ICCRUW shall not intervene in matters which are within the domestic jurisdiction of any State.
- **3.** Our Organization is based on the principle of equality among the same category of its Members.
- 4. The ICCRUW shall try to find neutral equitable conditions to which conflicting parties or belligerents are most likely to agree.

Art. 3. Composition

1. The ICCRUW shall be composed of States of

comparatively neutral character; the States trying to conciliate between belligerents; and their Diplomats.

- 2. The following States may be a member:
- a. A neutral State by its policy or by a treaty;
- b. A State which is demilitarized or has not force;
- c. A nonaligned State.
 - 3. Any ELFO VIPs and any Diplomats may be members of the ICCRUW, and try to find measures which both conflicting or belligerent paties would agree to.
- 4. The United Nations and any other organizations conducive to conciliation may be a member of the ICCRUW.
- 5. The ELFO of all humankind character, as an initiator of creation of the ICCRUW, has the exceptional status as an original Member of the ICCRUW.
- 6. If necessary, the General Meeting of the ICCRUW may recognize a State, an organization or an individual as a temporal member or consultant.

Art. 4. Principal organs

There are established as the principal organs of the present ICCRUW, a Representative, a Chairperson, a General Meeting, a Council and a Secretariat.

Art. 5. A Reresentative and a Chairperson

- 1. Representative represents the ICCRUW externaly, may negotiate with belligerents.
- 2. A Chairperson presides General Meeting, and in accordance with its decisions may decide internal and external matters.

Art. 6. General Meeting

- 1. The General Meeting is composed of all the Members of the ICCRUW.
- **2.** The main functions of the General Meeting include the following matters:
 - **a.** to deliberate and adopt a draft PROPOSAL on conciliation to be sent to billegerent parties;
 - **b**. to propose them such steps as may mitigate tension between them;
 - c. to elect a Representative and a Charperson;
 - d. to deliberate and decide the budget of the ICCRUW, provided that a State which PPP (purchasing power parity) is lower than 33% will be freed from membership fee.

Art. 7. The Council

- 1. There will be established a Council composed of less than 10 members.
- 2. Less than 7 members may be members of the Council for five years. The other members may be selected for one year.
- 3. Principal function of the Council is to present to the General Meeting a draft conciliation PROPOSAL to be sent to belligerents.

Art.8. Secretariat

- 1. Chairperson may appoint staffs of the Secretariat.
- 2. The Secretary-General shall act in that capacity in the ICCRUW, and perform such other functions as are entrusted to him by these organs.
- 3. Each Member undertakes to respect the exclusively international responsibilities of the Secretary-General and the staff.

Art. 9. Decision

- 1. A declaration of intention of the ICCRUW, its members, the General Meeting and meeting may be conducted, in principle, by the Internet, televisions, e-mails, faxes and so forth.
- **2.** A decision of the Principal organs and the other subsidiary organs shall be adopted by affirmative votes of majority of members present.
- 3. So long as a member-VIP or a member-Diplomat does not express yes or no, his or her representative by ELFO Charter, Art. 8 shall be regarded a mandatory, and his or her yes or no shall also regarded as the same with that of representative by the ELFO Charter.

Art. 10. The right to vote

- 1. a State has bellow-mentioned right to vote, ratio of its population being taken into account;
 - i 80 votes are given to a State with more than 1,000,000,000;
 - ii 70 votes are given to a State with the population from 100,000,000,000 to less than 1,000,000,000;
 - iii 60 votes are given to a State with the

population from 10,000,000 to 100,000,000.

iv 50 votes are given to a State with population from 1,000,000 to less than 10,000,000:

- v 40 votes are given to a State with the population from 100,000 to less than 1,000,000;
- vi 30 votes are given to a State with the population from 10,000 to less than 100,000;
- vii 20 votes are given to a State with the population from 1,000 to less than 10,000;
- viii 10 votes are given to a State with the population less than 1,000.
- 2. 80 votes are given to President of the ELFO, taking into account its all humankind character.
- 3. While an eligible State does not send its representative, an ELFO Diplomat from the country may become a member of the ICCRUW with 20% of votes of the State, each additional member will increase 20%. (so 5 compatriot-diplomats have the same votes with their State.)

Art. 11. Beginning of Conciliatory Activities

Even if no State accedes to the ICCRUW, it may begin conciliatory activities together with the original member ELFO.

Art. 12. All National Conciliation Conference

The ICCRUW encourages creation of All National Conciliation Conference to support the ICCRUW.

- N.B.1. Immedately after the effectuation of the present Rules, our ELFO is ready to talk about revision of the Rules.
- $\ensuremath{\mathrm{N.B.2.}}$ Provisionally our ELFO is ready to be the Secretariat of the ICCRUW.

From my old messages

[May 28, 2022]

ICO was created

An unique NGO named Earth-Loving Friendly Organization (ELFO) created another NGO named International Conciliation Organization (ICO) in May 17, 2022.

The establishment of the ICO will be epoch-making in history of peaceful settlement of international conflicts, which Charter of the United Nation, Article 33 stipulates.

ICCRUW was also created

Before the ICO was established, in April 26, 2022 the ELFO had already created a NGO: International Conciliation Commission on Russo-Ukrainian War (ICCRUW), but in May 17, 2022 the ICCRUW was reorganized as one of the organs of the ICO.

Firstly, the differences between the ELFO and the ICO are many, 2 of them are as followings:

- 1. The ELFO is far more comprehensive international NGO than the ICO, main purpose of which is conciliation.
- 2. The ELFO may be composed of many inclusive persons from common people to a State, while the ICO will be composed mainly of VIPs, Diplomats, Scholars, lawyer etc. (Of course, any State may join it.)

Secondly, the there are several differences between the ICO and the ICCRUW such as followings:

- i The ICO is a very unique international independent organization, while the ICCRUW is one of its organs.
- ii The ICO has jurisdiction not only over hostilities between belligerents, but also over 'conflict' which is of wider sense than war.
- iii The Head of the Organization is named as 'President' while that of the ICCRUW is a Representative.

iv In the Charter a term of 'General Assembly' is used while in the Rules of the ICCRUW 'General Meeting'.

v By the Charter it is obligatory for all the ELFO VIPs and Diplomats to be a member of the Oranization, while by the Rules of the ICCRUW neither VIPs nor Diplomats from belligerents are able to be a member of this ICCRUW.

If necessary, the General Meeting of the ICCRUW may recognize a State, an organization or an individual as a temporal member or consultant. (Rules, Article 3)

There is room to improve Charter of the ICO and Rules of ICCRUW. Soon I will propose a little bit of amendment.

Urgent is to elect of Leaders

Now let's elect leaders of the ICO and the ICCRUW. Leaders to be elected are the following 4 persons:

- 1. ICO President
- 2. ICO Chairperson
- 3. ICCRUW Representative
- 4. ICCRUW Chairperson

Firstly, 2 leaders of the ICO President and ICO Chairperson will be elected, secondly ICCRUW Representative and ICCRUW Chairperson.

Election of ICO President and ICO Chairperson

Regarding the first 2 leaders' election, unanimously the GA (which means 'unanimously all the members of the ICO) agreed to the Rules of electing its Leaders, which reads as follow:

Rules of election of leaders of the ICO

- 1. Any member of the ICO and the ICCRUW may be a candidate for the aforementioned leaders and an elector.
- 2. By 20:00 of June 1, 2022 the candidate shall send to a Committee for Election of Leaders (CEL) a

message on one's readiness to be President or a Chairperson by email. If there is only one candidate by that time, the candidate will be the leader.

- 3. The candidate shall be regarded exceptionally as having voted for oneself at the date of announcement of one's candidacy.
- 4. The candidate may express one's opinion at anytime and anywhere.
- 5. In June 5 (Sun.), 2022 from 9:00 of to 20:00 the CEL will conduct election if there are plural candidates for ICO President or a Chaiperson.
- 6. The following Charter, Art.9, Parag.3 will be applied to the present election:

So long as a member-VIP or a member-Diplomat does not express yes or no, his or her Representative by ELFO Charter, Art. 8 shall be regarded a mandatory, and his or her yes or no shall also regarded as the same with that of Representative by the ELFO Charter.

- 7. The Committee for Election of Leaders (CEL) will be composed of the following members:
- i Mr. Kunihiro Matsumoto, who was also a Chairperson of a Committee for Electing President of the ELFO.
- ii Mrs. HOPE Watanabe, who is a Representative of 65 ELFO Diplomats.
- iii Mr. Keisuke Sakurai, who is a ELFO member and administrative scrivener.
- 8. The CEL is competent to lay down detailed regulation on the present election.

Please declare candidancy!! 5 days remain till the time limit of the declaration

Rules of election of leaders of the ICCRUW

At present there is no rules on election of the Representative and the Chairperson of the ICCRUW. So I present the following draft Rules to the GA of the ICO. They are almost the same with the above-mentioned Rules:

- 1. Any member of the ICO and the ICCRUW may be a candidate for the aforementioned leaders and an elector.
- 2. By 20:00 of June 7, 2022 the candidate shall send to a Committee for Election of Leaders (CEL) a message on one's readiness to be Representative or a Chairperson by email. If there is only one candidate

by that time, the candidate will be the leader.

- 3. The candidate shall be regarded exceptionally as having voted for oneself at the date of announcement of one's candidacy.
- 4. The candidate may express one's opinion at anytime (enen now) and anywhere.
- 5. In June 7 (Sun.), 2022 from 9:00 of to 20:00 the CEL will conduct election if there are plural candidates for ICCRUW Representative or a Chaiperson.
- 6. The following Charter, Art.9, Parag.3 will be applied to the present election:

So long as a member-VIP or a member-Diplomat does not express yes or no, his or her Representative by ELFO Charter, Art. 8 shall be regarded a mandatory, and his or her yes or no shall also regarded as the same with that of Representative by the ELFO Charter.

- 7. The Committee for Election of Leaders (CEL) will be composed of the following members:
- i Mr. Kunihiro Matsumoto, who was also a Chairperson of a Committee for Electing President of the ELFO.
- ii Mrs. HOPE Watanabe, who is a Representative of 65 ELFO Diplomats.
- iii Mr. Keisuke Sakurai, who is a ELFO member and administrative scrivener.
- 8. The CEL is competent to lay down detailed regulation on the present election.

Please declare candidancy Also for learders of the ICCRUW!!

At present there no 'Chairperson' in the ICO, but I ask ELFO Chair Irina Karpekina to preside ICO GA temporally, and decide the adoption of the aforementioned Rules at 20:00 of May 30, 2022 if there is no bjection. Though the Rules are not adopted yet, members have free right to express their readiness to be a leader of the ICCRUW.

Draft of the Rules of the **ICCRUW**

Sorry for presenting the 3rd Draft of the ICCRUW. There are mainly 3 points of revisions

- 1. Personal sphere of Diplomats is increased (Art.3, Par. 3): namely:
 - 3. Provisionally any ELFO VIPs and any Diplomats, excepting belligerent Diplomats, may be members of the ICCRUW until their States accede to it officially.
- 2. Diplomats' obligation (Art. 3, Para. 4):
 - 4. An ELFO Diplomat whose State abstained from voting in the United Nations in March 3, 2022, March 24, 2022 and April 7, 2022 shall be a member of the ICCRUW.
- 3. Simplification of the ICCRUW's obligations:

Phrase 'Conflicting parties' is changed to 'belligerent'. This terminology is far clearer than wider conception 'conclicting parties'.

You know, in April 1, 2022 I showed you my draft message to be sent to States which may be a member of the ICCRUW (International

Conciliation Commission on Russo-Ukrainian War).

I sent such a message to 38 Diplomats of neutral States aforementioned. It is very lucky that in March 26, 2022 a Dip. Mr. C Can Canikli (pic.) joined our ELFO, because Turkey is also making efforts to conciliate between belligerents of Russo-Ukrainian War.

Very important documents

Even members of opponent States shall go friendly along the FLAW!!

Because of our Earth-Loving Friendly organization

Here and there I said that system of our ELFO is different fundamentaly from the UN, where unamicable diplomats of opponent States comdemn bitterly the other, throwing mud at each other.

Foreseeing that in future there will be many members whose States are not friendly, and considering imperative necessity to promote friendship irrespective colorful differences among numerous members, in February10, 2022 the GA (General Assembly) adopted General Policy for Friendship.(http://mopw.org/Ira42-7ga,%20repr..pdf)

There were many points, however, to be added to it in order to make it clear what is a friendly or unfriendly act. In the below mentioned Rules for Friendship you can see my ideas. Any member, however, may present me one's opinion on promoting friendship though our GA adopted the the following supplimematary Rules as aforementioned.

Rules for Friendship

GA decision (FEB 10, 2022)

The greatest friendship of all the members

Foreseeing that in future there will be many members whose States are not friendly, and considering imperative necessity to promote friendship irrespective coloful differences among numerous members, in February 10, 2022 the General Assembly of our Earth-Loving Friendly Organization (ELFO) adopted the following rules.

Done in February 10, 2022 in Sapporo

Article 1. Fainess

- 1. The ELFO shall be fair on contributing to easing strained relations not only among nations, but also among ELFO members concerned.
- 2. When a member complains of one of the conflicting party, the ELFO shall know also opinion of other party. (Blue paragraphs were added to the origina 'General Policy for Friendship)

Article 2. Friendly Manners

1.Any ELFO Family member shall be friendly even if among members concerning a given international or domestic conflict. At least members shall observe international courtesy and etiquette.

Possibly it may be uneasy to maintain friendly attitude between conflicting VIPs or Diplomats. Nevertheless members shall be friendly. Because our ELFO is deeply based on, and originate from, the attachment of importance to friendship as clearly expressed in the name our ELFO: Earth-Loving Friendly Organization. Our ELFO expects that Diplomats' relationship and friendship are different from those observed in the United Nations, for example.

2. Members shall not use wording which would clearly injure other party's emotion, which usually friends would not choose among them.

Article 3. Finding of Illegality

1. Not only the Interstate Department, the Boundary Territorial Department, but also ELFO members in general shall neither declare illegality of a given action nor regard it as morally or ethically permissible, provided that it is stipulated in other ELFO rules.

First of all, I want all the members to pay attention to friendly amicable character of our ELFO as its Charter lays downs:

Article 11 (Friendly character) 1. In a provisional period the Organization shall attach a great importance to its friendly activities as participants in Ancient Olympic Games stopped war and enjoyed games.

Such norms and systems are stipulated here and there in the Charter. For example, Article 56, Paragraph 4 reads as follows:

4. Regarding the title to a contentious territory, the Council shall maintain principle that it refrains from legal conclusion, and it is an international court or the Earth-Loving Amicable Court (ELAC) which gives judgement on it.

If a member Diplomat declares clearly that an opponent's given action is unlawful or aggression, the other opponent Diplomats would retort vehemently as in the UN, and we could not maintain friendly atmosphere in the ELFO. We ELFO need not to

imitate and repeat UN system because the ELFO is a bud growing for promotion of friendship of all members and all human beings.

The ELFO Charter designed very good scheme for the ELFO as well as for all human being such as Solidarity system (http://mopw.org/e-SC-n2.pdf), but it is not enough. There is room to be improved more.

2. Regarding illegality of a given action, the ELFO shall maintain principle that it refrains from legal conclusion, and it is an international court or the Earth-Loving Amicable Court (ELAC) which gives judgement on it.

Article 4. VIPs' Admission

- 1. Those Heads of State, Ministers of Foreign Affairs, and Diolomats (hereinafter referred to as VIPs), who condemned other party of a given conflict before acceding to the ELFO, may join our Organization.
- 2. Once the VIPs join our ELFO, however, they shall not declare, before the ELFO, other opponent's action in question as international delinquency.

Outside the ELFO they may do so.

They shall also respect friendly character of our Earth-Loving FRIENDLY Organization, paying more attention to our ELFO's Statements or Proposals.

Here you can understand very unique and good character of our ELFO. Even if VIPs of antagonistic States avoid international intercourse in many places, here they may rather want to be more or less amicable because of its very valuable golden thread.

Article 5. Imperative Answer

- 1. When the VIPs want the ELFO to deliberate their international conflict, the concerned organ of the ELFO shall make up a draft Declaration or Statement as soon as possible.
- 2. It shall be imperative for the VIPs to participate in the constructive deliberation for settling conflicts, to answer questions admitted by a Chairperson of a geven organ.

Article 6. Messenger of Documents

- 1. For the pupose of promoting friendship our ELFO may make a STATEMENT or a PROPOSAL (not Recommendation) to the belligerents.
- 2. The Diplomats shall cooperate as a messenger to send the STATEMEMT or the DECLARATION to their Government, and also send their Governments' message to the ELFO.
- 3. Any VIPs including Diplomats may expresse one's opinions so long as it is constructive, mentioning an ELFO STATEMENT or an PROPOSAL.

Article 7. VIPs of Neutral States

- 1. When the ELFO try to contribute to settling international conflicts, it shall attach importance, among others, opinions of neutral counties and nonaligned countries as well as those of parties to this crisis.
- 2. The ELFO may organize in adcance a permanent cociliative organ or ad hoc committee for a given conflict.

My Dear Earth-Loving Family

Aforementioned Rules for Friendship is so important a document that we must deepen menbers' understanding.

The fundamental thought is, in a word, an OASIS, where members must be friendly, even among members of opponent STATES.

ELFO Statement on Russo-Ukrainian Crisis

GA Decision (FEB ,14, 2022)

1. We the ELFO (Earth-Loving Friedly Organization) are very apprehensive of the current Russo-Ukrainian crisis becaue it causes world-wide confrontation. From

the bottom of our heart, we WLFO wish that these problems be settled peacefully.

- 2. We expect that conflicting parties make utmost efforts to settle Russo-Ukrainian crisis by peaceful means provided for in the UN Charter, Article 33, including judicial settlent even partly.
- 3. The parties will neither use warlike words nor threaten other parties with use of force which the UN Charter provides for clearly. (Art. 2, Para.4)
- 4. Our ELFO is opinion that an UN Member-State may use armed forces only in 2 cases, firstly, if an armed attack occurs against a Member, and secondly, when the UN recognizes use of armed forces by a Member.
- 5. Both of the parties shall not increase armaments near the border along opponents' States, rather reduce them unilaterally or by agreement.
- 6. We ELFO wishes that conflicting parties observe truce agreement strictly, and if it is violated frequently, they invite international supervisory organization.
- 7. Along the border concerned the interested parties will establish mutual demitarized zone, which will be widened with lapes of time.
- 8. More or less will be necessary mutual compromise. If it is difficult for the parties to achieve it, the ELFO proposes to create a fair commission for it.
- 9. Parties will promise in advance that they will never use any kind of nuclear weapons in case conflicts grow into military conflicts or war.



Urgent Statement on Russo-Ukrainian Crisis



Done in Febryary 21, 2022 Religion and Ethics Council Acting Chief Edmario Peixinho

Regarding urgent apprehensive Russo-Ukrainian Crisis, our ELFO (Earth-Loving Friendly Association), President of which is Hon. Prof. Rikio Kaneko, announced its STATEMENT of general form in February 10, 2022 as mentioned in P.S.

Today I come here to state additionally from religious and ethical view-points in an act of respect, solidarity and sensitivity to preside over my statement to the brothers of all diplomacy and media supremacy. Ethics and religiosity are allies for a peaceful life. But if Russo-Ukrainian crisis continues as it is, or war breaks out, not only material values, but also ethics and religiosity of human beings will be damaged considerably.

I expect much, therefore, from the efforts of the brothers of diplomacy and media supremacy the development and the conjunctive interests in pacifying the peace between Ukraine and Russia.

This crisis is very worrying and is emotionally shaking all the nations, among others, that are allied with Russia and Ukraine in the world economy. This leads to the question I share with you: is it possible to please God by oppressing others? In my view, the sense of religiosity and ethics go in the same direction. Or is there any religion or ethics that encourages killing, stealing, coveting, lying or feeling superior to another?

Normal religious and ethical sense demands harmony, respect, love, good, beauty, peace, friendship, and rule of law, neither war nor self-righteousness, avoiding worst scenario of river of blood. Respect for others and for the law is crucial for us to live in a more inclusive society. Religious intolerance, racism, all kinds of abuse, cruelty to animals, therefore, go against the basic principles of divine, ethical or material laws. Respect and love are the key to a good life.

When we plant something good, even if we are not seeing it, it is there forming its roots, and blooms in its own time or "in God's time". From bottom of heart, representing the Religion and Ethics Council, I wish that Russo-Ukrainian crisis be settled peacefully, not by war.

GA Chair's Statement on R.vs.U. Crisis, N.2

Regarding urgent Russo-Ukrainian Crisis, our ELFO (Earth-Loving Friendly Association), President of which is Hon. Prof. Rikio Kaneko, announced its STATEMENT of general form in February 10, 2022 as mentioned in the URL: http://mopw.org/Ira-43-Festa-statement-rep.pdf

Seeing current serious crisis, very apprehensive not only of pressing disaster of both countries, but also rapid worsening changes around the world, as Chair of the General Assembly of the ELFO, I issued the first STATEMENT on Russo-Ukrainian Crisis, which you see in the aforementioned URL. Today (FEB, 25, 2022), seeing yesterday's Russian sudden invation to Ukrainian plural military objects, I am obliged to release the second STATEMENT on Russo-Ukrainian Crisis as follows (Blue phrases were added):

First of all, it is imperative for world leaders to act promptly, continuing negotiation because absence or severance of diplomatic relations is dangerous.

Negotiation is far more valuable and necessary than military actions. The former way leads to peace while the latter to destruction and possible and horrible catastrophy of humankind.

Secondly, military fighting of conflicting parties should be suspended immediatetly by agreement or unilaterally. Otherwise it would worsen situation.

If military y action of a conflicting party continues, the other party also will try to reinforce its armed forces, and such military confrontation will escalate toward more mutual killing, and possibly final catastrophy.

Thirdly, it is very desirable to reinforce existing or new International Supervisory Organization (ISO) because the ISO serves considerably peace-building.

It is said that the existing supervisory organization does not function well. It is the very reason why I propose more effective and competent ISO.

Fourthy, as for the ISO the United Nations, among others, Secretary-general, should propose the formation of the ISO.

Fifthly, if concerned parties fail to organize it, I propose that our ELFO will make up a draft Rules on the ISO to be composed mainly of neutral countries.

Sixthly, creation of organizations for sease-fire. Once Russian invasion began yesterday (FEB 25, 2022), creation of such organizations has priority over the ISO. Such an organization may exist together with other organizations of the same character.

Seventhly, I think that the ELFO itself may play a certain positive role for promoting process toward peace, creating an ELFO Committee for Amicably Promoting Sease-fire (CAPS) to be composed of neutral members. So I propose reation of the CAPS to our ELFO General Assembly

My Statement on Russo-Ukrainian Crisis

Where Diplomatic negotiation has failed to



prevent Russian invasion to Ukraine, and now (February 26, 20022) Russian armed forces which is superior overwhelmingly to Ukrainian forces, approaches Kiev, I propose the

following remedy of strategic approaches;

- 1. I appeal that in particular actions by the UN Security Council, its Secretary General, and of the UN Member-States are needed mainly in economic sector because international military reactions, especially war within Ukraine, is very dangerous from the first stage, which may lead to nuclear catastrophy.
- 2. ELFO (Earth-Loving Friendly Organization) must constitute a team of Diplomats who will be tasked with a duty to talk with Countries that have diplomatic relations with Russia and Ukraine for the purpose of a) settling the present conflict peacefully and b) creating situation where Russian troops may evacuate from Ukraine. A team of Neutral Heads of State should be formed also for the aforementioned 2 purposes.
- 3. As these peaceful efforts are the only way to minimize collateral damage of property and loss of lives, world leaders must not give up on peaceful means of solving conflicts, including negotiation for neutralization of Ukraine like Finland. Severance of diplomatic relations should be avoided by all means.
- 4. I suggest that ELFO should form an Emergency Response Team (ERT) which will be tasked with mobilizing Countries, the Civil Society and individual Companies and person to donate for war victims.

5. All NATO members including their partners should not send troops to Ukraine or backup this war. If they do so, Russia will not relent and more lives will be lost. If Ukraine continues to respond, using her Diplomatic Alliance, this conflict is as good as over. But if Ukraine also choose the Military response, then the world must prepare for an economic disaster, fierce than what Covid 19 just unleashed.



As Chief of Interstate Department (ID) of the ELFO, where 262 VIPs and Diplomats of Ministry Foreign Affairs sit as of February 28, 2022, today I issue present STATEMENT, the important points of which are as follows.

1. First of all, from the bottom of my heart I welcome beligerent leaders' readiness (FEB 27, 2022) to begin negotiation, and appeal to world people for creation of good

atmosphere for ending war.

- 2. Secondly, in order to avoid horrible killing each other our reason and insight demands immediate cease-fire between belligerents as was declared or stated in our ELFO documents.
- 3. I will try, together with ELFO President Hon. Prof. Rikio Kaneko and the other ELFO members, to create good atmosphere so that the ID be conducive to mitigating confrontation and putting an end to present warfare.
- 4. For this end, I propose that our ELFO will try immediately to organize Conciliatory work which shall be fair to both belligerents. In our ELFO there are already some Diplomats from Ukraine, but not from Russia. We will be pleased, therefore, if some Russian Diplomats join our Organization.
- 5. The conciliatory organization (a committee) may be composed on the basis of an agreement between 2 belligerents, but in case it is impossible to create it, the ELFO will set it up voluntarily as fairly as possible.
- 6. I stress inestimable value of life. All human beings old and young, man and woman, strong and weak, living in the Orient and the Occident, irrespective differences, should not killing each other, but talk, not using weaponry, freezing military action.

My STATEMENT on Current World Situation

March 6, 2022 Chairperson of the ELFO **ICS** Dr. Prof. Sreenivasulu



As a Chairperson of the ICS (International Commission for Statute) of the ELAC (Earth-Loving Amicable Court), today (March 6) I have honor to issue an urgent STATEMENT on current world situation, among others, legal aspects and the ELAC.

To my regret, our ELAC could not play any role in the past Russo-Russian Crisis and in the present Russo-Ukrainian War though it has more or less potential competence to deal with not only these problems, but also many legal conflicts around the world.

Our President Rikio Kaneko, Hon. Prof. of Sapporo University stressed several times the importance to create Interim (Provisional) Court, foreseeing such dangerous situation as outbreak of war or other irreparable loss caused by violence.

It is necessary to develop our ELAC all the more as soon as possible in general, considering also fundamental structure of our ELFO as seen in the following rule:

Regarding illegality of a given action, the ELFO shall maintain principle that it refrains from legal conclusion, and it is an international court or the Earth-Loving Amicable Court (ELAC) which gives judgement on it. (Rules for Friendship, Article 3)

Life, Fairness, Friendship, Peace, Self-Control

It is difficult, however, to develop early

the ELAC where 15 Judges will sit, so as the first step I propose to start with creating a simplified ELAC as follows:

1.In a provisional period of development of our ELFO (Charter, Chapter 4), the ELAC may be composed of 5 Judges (hereinafter referred to as Court).

2. The ELFO will apply, to the Court, the Purposes and Principles of the ELAC which were adopted by the ELFO General Assembly in December of 2020.

- 3. A jurist from a conflicting State may not sit in the ELAC to avoid chances of prejudice and bias which is prohibited in any context of law and policy
- 4. ELFO shall thrive to debate the text of international law in the context of Ukraine and Russia debacle in the current and challenging times
- 5. ELFO shall also work towards ensuring that international law is neither only on paper nor a paper dog by bringing constructive debates and initiations which can be worked out at the ground level.
- 6. ELAC function and philosophy shall be to provide constructive solutions to the international legal disputes including the current dispute between Russia and Ukraine.

If Cuba had been ready to make her country neutral and demilitarized, would the USA have welcomed it? Undoubtedly the answer is "Yes" because it would have been far safer for the USA.
