I have honor to express that I want your Excellency so much to join our world-wide ELFO (Earth-Loving Friendly Organization) which is developing month after month. Now as of January 1, 2022 there are 230 VIPs and Diplomats in our ELFO, and about 1400 various members from around the world.

Our ELFO is only one unique international organization where VIPs and Diplomats can feel friendly atmosphere, bguaranteed by our Solidarity System and other means which our Charter and other rules stipulate. (http://mopw.org/e-SC-n2.pdf, pp.1~3)

In the UN unfriendly States' Diplomats are unamicable, while in our ELFO they can be friendly, and <u>must</u> be so. Here you can see HOPPES and LIGHTS of future, on which you will see a concrete case in the present mail magazine:

When a member-Diplomat was afraid of war among Egypt, Ethiopia and Sudan, our ELFO sent to the above 3 conflicting States a hearty **peaceful PROPOSAL** to the effect that if they cannot settle a problem of a dam construction, we propose to submit the case to the International Court of Justice.

Then our ELFO adopted Regional Solidarity system which will solidify regional friendly relations.



Solidarity Council

This Solidarity system is an international election system which meets the demand of the 21 century.

One World Electoral District (OWED) is what is to be created in future, but its variation of Regional

Electoral District (RED) may be conceivable. So the ELFO decided to promote it, firstly, within our Organization itself.

Friendly diplomatic relations among ELFO members

Regional ELFO Solidarity Council

The General Assembly created Regional ELFO Solidarity Council (RESC) as follows:

- 1. Composition:
 - a. (...Omission...)
 - b. The RESC may be composed of the ELFO President, (...Omission...) and all the Diplomats and the members of concerned States of a given conflict.

(...Omission...)

- 2. Functions: Principal function is to contribute to the peaceful settlement of a given conflict, (...Omission...)
- 3. Principles:
 - a. Every member shall try to be friendly, avoid unfriendly words and behavior.
 - b. Every member shall refrain from asking other members to take an important action when situation is not clear, and while the RESC is deliberating the given conflict.
- 4. (...Omission...)
- 5. Present rules shall be applied not only in time of peace (including time of severance of diplomatic relations), but also in time of war, provided that in case of war present rules shall be applied harmoniously with domestic laws of belligerent States.

In international law is system of 'Protecting Power' *i.e.* a neutral State entrusted by the belligerent with the protection of the interests of its nationals. Likewise in time of war our RESC, which is neutral, may be conducive to the belligerents.




Mechanism of promoting friendship

In the United Nations it is very difficult for diplomats of rival States to promote friendship between them. On the contrary, in our ELFO they can be maintain friendship, or brake worsening of situation. Because essentially our ELFO is of such character. See ELFO Charter, please.

Article 11 (Friendly character) stipulates as follows:

- 1. the Organization shall attach a great importance to its friendly activities as participants in Ancient Olympic Games stopped war and enjoyed games.
- 2. the Organization shall open an actual international meeting so as to promote international friendship and mutual understanding, conducting adjustment of difference of opinions through daily communication by telephone, fax, Internet, etc.
- **3.** In any case, assuming friendly and constructive attitude, a member shall refrain from emotional self-righteous speech and action.



Invitation to our ELFO as an observer

If VIPs and Diplomats want to be an observer, who can receive important info regularly on our activities, we welcome also such kind of involvement.

These days our ELFO became more active: It began to cover various international fields such as

- L. Dam conflict among Egypt, Ethiopia and Sudan
- 2. Israeli-Palestinian conflict
- 3. Denuclearization of East, South, and West Asia,
- 4. Investment in gold mine and fisheries,
- 5. Increasing more Earth-Loving Companies
- 6. Plan of Earth-Loving Amicable Bank
- 7. Plan of Earth-Loving Friendship Universities,
- 8. Earth-Loving Amicable Festival etc.



Our Interstate Council of the ELFO paid due attention also to miserable Israeli-Palestinian cinflict, and adopted unanimously a decision on peaceful settlent, applying solidarity system of the ELFO. (See P.S.)

Now ELFO General Assenply adopted very important **Principles of disarmament**. (See P.S.)

In order to promote rule of law in our Earth community, the ELFO created an ELAC (Earth-Loving Amicable Court) though it is also 'a baby'. There are several kinds of courts, some of which began to open their door. These courts have jurisdiction only when conflicting parties agreed to it by compromiss.

Our ELFO is such an inclusive Organization that its 23 Councils will treat many international matters.

VIPs' & Diplomats' Privileges

Our VIPs and Diplomats have considerable privileges in the ELFO mainly in 2 sectors: votes and investment.

A. Votes: even one Diplomat has as many votes as a Head of State, ratio of its population being taken into account. Thus, for example, an Indian Diplomat has 80 votes. If more than one diplomat from one country become a member of the Council, each additional member will increase the basic votes of a given State by 20% and the cumulative votes will be prorated among the diplomats.

B. Investment: In July 20, 2021 the Interstate Council decided that the ELFO shall pay much attention to the VIPs' and Diplomats' countries when ELFO promote such projects as defeating Covic-19, creation of the ELFU (Earth-Loving Friendship Universities), ELAB (Earth-Loving Amicable Bank), the ELC (Earth-Loving Company), the ELAF (Earth-Loving Amicable Festival) etc.

P.S.2. Activities of Nowadays

Though our ELFO is, so to speak, a baby less than one year, it is growing stronger day after day. As you see here, it adopted already several important decisions such as concerning construction of Renaissance dam in Ethiopia, Israeli-Palestinian conflict, creation of the ELAC (Earth-Loving Amicable Court), Principles of disarmaments etc.

A. PROPOSAL sent to African conflicting States

It reads, among others, as follows:

Our dear member-Diplomat Amr Mahisin was very apprehensive of worsening situation concerning construction of the Renaissance dam, which may lead to war, and our ELFO GA (General Assembly) paid due attention to it, knew seriousness of the conflict, and in May the 3rd, 2021 the GA adopted unanimously 3 Articles, which, we suppose, you have already read.

This time our ELFO has honor also to send the PROPOSAL N.2 to our 3 Dear Heads of State relating to Renaissance dam construction, with some phrases (red ones) added to the 1st PROPOSAL and with quite new addition of paragraph 4:

Our ELFO wishes that the case concerning Renaissance dam be settled peacefully and fairly by diplomatic negotiation or other peaceful means of settlement such as conciliation etc.;

If Parties to the present conflict cannot settle it by diplomatic negotiation or other peaceful means of settlement, we hope that the case will be submitted to International Court of Justice;

Anyway we wish that Parties to the present case and concerned persons refrain from warlike words, threat of force, much more preparation for war and actual war.

==== Solidarity Council =====

This Solidarity system is international election system which meets the demand of the 21 century (http://mopw.org/e-SC-n2.pdf, pp. 1~3). One World Electoral District (OWED) is what is to be created in future, but its regional variation of 3 States Electoral District (3SED) may be conceivable.

Concerned Sates may create 3SED as they like. Our ELFO suggests, however, that if it is difficult for the 3 States to create it, then our ELFO propose the following standard model:

- a. 50 Parliamentarians whom a Diet of each State appoints shall be an elector
- b. From each State may be elected Solidarity Councilors from 18 years up, with due regard to ratio of national population. This grouping of ratio of population shall be as follows:

- c. Principal function of the Solidarity Council is to contribute to settlement of conflicts among Egypt, Ethiopia and Sudan.
- d. These Solidarity Councilors will have diplomatic privileges and immunity.

Our ELFO wishes, from the bottom of our heart, that present case be settled by peaceful means, neither by force nor self-righteous action. War would surely cause not only huge economic loss, but also numerous deaths which would redden mother-Nile with blood.

On the contrary, we wish concerned countries:

Development, Welfare, Commonwealth,

Cooperation, New Orders

(From 55 Golden Words of Earth-Loving Amicable Way)

B. Israeli-Palestinian Conflict

Now our Interstate Council deliberated Israeli-Palestinian conflict and adopted also unanimously PROPOSAL to be sent to conflicting parties to the following effect:

- 1.to stop immediately military action if any, and never commence hostilities;
- 2.to receive supervisory organ of the United Nations to ensure and maintain peace:
- 3. to submit settlement of conflicts to the ICJ (International Court of Justice) if they cannot solve by other peaceful means;
- 4. to creat a SC (Solidarity Commission), members of which will be elected by 50 Parliamentarians or Deputies of both conflicting parties respectively.

Such kind of the SG derives from our ELFO Solidarity system promoting friendly relations, which may be applied to any international conflict.

The Interstate Council is going to deliberate also international conflict around Cameroon soon.

C. Principles of Disarmament

On the otherhand, ELFO Solidarity Council deliberated Principles of Disarmament of weapons of mass destruction, the draft of which I had presented, and adopted it that reads as follows:

Nuclear weapon is an enemy to all human beings



Principles of Disarmament of weapons of mass destruction

1. Earth-Loving Friendly Organization (ELFO) and all its organs shall be opposed to increase of production and export of weapons of mass destruction (nuclear weapons, biological weapons and chemical weapons) and conventional weapons.

I am sure that all or almost of the Solidarity Councilors agree to this view point because their mind is Earth-loving. But in our ELFO there are also members from a country possessing weapons of mass destruction, they have a right to express their own opinion.

2. Convinced that, first of all, the two great nuclear-weapon States shall decrease their unnecessary nuclear warheads early and considerably, the ELFO aims at the stage, as one of its nuclear diplomatic purposes, where the sum of the nuclear warheads possessed by these States will amount to the sum of the nuclear warheads possessed by the other nuclear-weapon States.

In early 2019, more than 90% of world's 13,865 <u>nuclear</u> weapons were owned by Russia and the United States. [19] (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Weapon of mass destruction)

3. The ELFO is based upon the position that nuclear-weapon States shall agree not to carry out preemptive strike by their nuclear weapons nor to attack by these weapons against non-nuclear-weapon States, and that, while the two great nuclear-weapon

States are reducing weapons of mass destruction, the other States possessing such kinds of weapons shall not increase nor develop them.

- **4.** In process of comprehensive general and complete disarmament by all the States of the world the disarmament shall be be carried out under strict and effective international control.
- **5.** A State possessing weapons of mass destruction or conventional weapons shall abolish them early or, if it is impossible, pursue to reduce them and military personnel by stages, and owe a duty to possess them very restrictively or abolish them at the last stage.
- **6.** The ELFO supports that States will create and enlarge denuclearized zones where they prohibit not only possession of nuclear weapons, but also their production, distribution and carrying in there, will present its own proposal to States and organizations interested.

D. Rule of Law on our Planet

From a view point of rule of law current international community is primititive. Only 1/3 (one thirds) of States agree to the jurisdiction of the most authoritative Gardian of law: International Court of Justice. How can a Government maintain domestic order if it would be permissible that 2/3 of its nationals don't agree to jurisdiction of domestic corts?

It is clear that our ELFO must contribute to promotinting rule of law on our Planet. So that the ELFO Charter lays down establishment of the Earth-Loving Amicable Court (ELAC) for all humankind, and in December of 2020 the General Assembly dopted "Purposes and Priciples" of the (ELAC). After revision present rules reads as follows:

THE STATUT OF

THE EARTH-LOVING AMICABLE COURT

CHAPTER 1 Purposes and Principles

Article 1 (purposes) The principal purposes of THE EARTH-LOVING AMICABLE COURT (ELAC) are:

- 1. to contribute to the settlement of conflicts and establishment of peace in the vast space from the view point of values not only of States but also of all mankind, all the Earth and the Cosmos, forming a clear view of the demand of the times;
- 2. to contribute to the settlement of social, environmental, human rights problems and disarmament problem including the nuclear weapons, and for this purpose to strengthen world-wide or regional cooperation;
- 3. to give legal advices, to answer legal questions, and approaching contesting parties friendly, to exercise good offices, to mediate among parties and to undertake conciliation, contributing to the settlement of the conflicts;
- 4. to request the contesting parties to submit the problem to an court of justice when they cannot settle legal contentious problems by negotiation and the other peaceful means;
- 5. to open the door of the ELAC when there is not response to the said request, and to show the most authoritative and solid legal judgment in the world in which many ELA-Friendly Judges (ELAFJ), and ELA-Friendly Advocates (ELAFA) may take part.

- Article 2 (principles) The ELAC shall follow the below-mentioned principles.
- 1. In the ELAC shall dominate the principles of pacifism, democracy, respect of human rights and participation of the general public in a certain matters;
- 2. The ELAC shall respect international law and not intervene in the internal matters of any State, shall not discriminate apriori (in advance) against specific nations nor stimulate bad national emotion;
- 3. On legal judgment, the ELAC shall make an effort not to bring forth a duality of norms between existing law and the legal judgment, provided that Judges shall take into account the necessity of development of the Earth Community in accordance with demand of the times;
- 4. The ELAC is one of Principal organs of the ELFO of international NGO of neutral and all humankind character, and shall not be, in principle, a legal person of any country, provided that the ELAC shall cooperate with the Governments, the United Nations, international organizations, NGO and NPO;
- 5. The ELAC may be composed of ELAFJ (ELA Friendly Judge), ELAFA (ELA-Friendly Advocate), ELAFC (ELA-Friendly Conciliator) and Registry.
- 6. The ELAC shall advise many times contesting parties to compromise during litigation; and
- 7. In the ELAC the principle of parties' autonomy shall be recognized widely so far as it does not infringe both domestic law and international law.
- a. When conflicting parties want help of the ELFO members besides the those of the ELAC, the latter shall not intervene in their affairs;
- b. When conflicting parties want an ELAFA to be their Judge, the latter may agree to it;

- c. When conflicting parties wish somewhat special requirements or special composition of an ELAC for them, such a temporal Court may be created.
- 8. If the ELAC and conflicting parties agree to the anonymous system of the ELAC, the Court may apply it to a given case.
- 9. The ELAC may the Internet as much as possible, and shall contribute to development of digital lawsuit.
- 10. The ELAC is based, as a rule, on members' good intentions and volunteerism, provided that the ELAFJ, ELAFA, ELAFC and parties to a conflict may agree to payment for remuneration.

From now on present and former Judges and Advocates may act as ELAFJ and ELAFA so far as such actions are neither against domestic nor international law.

The above mentioned paper was adopted by the General Assembly of the ELFO in December of 2020.

No problem with creation of the ELAC

The ELAC is very innovative Court for all human beings, however, with restrictive functions in a sense that it has jurisdiction, in principle, when conflicting parties agree to it by compromiss, and that it will never use force.

Even so, some may doubt its legality: is it permissible to creat such court? So I will show some cases which will avoid such a doubt:

- 1. Island Palmas case; One Judge Prof. Max Huber, (above pic.) a Swiss lawyer and diplomat, settled Palmas case within 3 years and 2 months. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Island_of_Palmas_Case
- 2. Walfish bay case: Don Joaquin Fernandez Prida, Prof. of international law of Madrid University. settled the case within 2 years and 3 months. http://legal.un.org/riaa/cases/vol_XI/263-308.pdf;
- **3.Mt.Arlu case**: This case is very interesting in the sense that it was settled with **4 days** by King of Saudiarabia.

4. The Attilio Regolo and Other Vessels case: Arbitration agreement of 29 December 1944. Award: 14 January 1945. It was decided within 17 days by one Arbitrator Prof. Jose de Messia of the University of Madrid. Parties are 4 States.

The ELFO has created Plural Judges Human Rights Court, Plural Judges Territorial Arbitration Court etc. and now the General Assembly adopted a decision on **Friendly Interim Court** as follows:

The FIC shall only conduct preparatory affairs and preparatory trial of a case submitted to the FIC, and not examine any question of the merit, provided that the FIC may recommend Provisional Measures or Urgent measures to contesting parties.

Firstly, the FIC can recommend Provisional or Urgent Measures to the contesting parties. By "Urgent Measures" we mean measures of a provisional nature designed to meet matters of paramount urgency which may be decided by the President alone or on the basis of Judges' answers to a questionnaire submitted by them.

The President of the Court shall indicate or recommend urgent measures as soon as possible, among others, as for the following acts:

- a. Any individual, autonomy and State may submit a conflict which, by their judgement, their right is or will be endangered in the forms bellow mentioned:
- b. an act or its preparation which is clearly against law (international or domestic law) and which is condemned by domestic or international society and the United Nations.
- c. an act, its preparation or suggestion which is probably against domestic or international law but realization of which would clearly aggravate the circumstances of the Earth or Cosmos.
- d. an act, its preparation or suggestion which tramples down lives and fundamental rights of many Citizens as a result of belligerent acts no matter which party is aggressive; and
- e. preparation which is probably against domestic or international law, and which would influence upon vested rights and make impossible recovery of the present state probably or perfectly if the preparation would be carried out.

Secondly, even if the FIC is neither able to express its own conclusive opinion on legal facts nor legal principles and rules to be applied to a given case, it may request actors, conflicting parties or specialists to give one's opinion or evidence and, if the FIC itself is ready, the Court may investigate the case.

Cordification



ELFO President Rikio Kaneko's proposal:

As is already agreed, a Vice-President of the ELAC, Dr. Prof. Sreenivasulu will present a draft Statute of the ELAC. He is a

Chairperson of a committee for it.



As is expected, the 1st Vice-President of the ELAC, Adv. <u>Sameer Shah</u> will begin to embody a Friendly Interim Court.



As a Judge Praven K. is ready to be a Vice-President of the Court, he will be responsible to make up a draft code of Plural Judge Courts.



As <u>Adv Chitranjali Negi</u> has contributed considerably to starting stage of the ELFO and has written articles on courts by the Internet, and when she agrees,

President Rikio Kaneko will appoint her as a Vice-President of the ELAC.

E. Earth Loving Amicable Festival

Friendship Council is very important because even at present time of the 21 century happen many conflicts. The Council will contribute to mitigate such antagonism, trying to promote friendship among world people.

International fests have been held by my POCNA (Peaceful Organization of Community of North-east Asia). But in our ELFO at present situation of coronavirus, we are obliged to hold e-Earth-Loving Festival, in which many ELA-Artists take part.

construction of HOUSES for Peace, Welfare & Amity. I already built such a HOUSE N.1 n Sapporo in 2014 (pic.). This is a base of the

ELFO where many ideas and plan appear, being realized.

The Hottest News about us ELFO

A. Remuneration of 290% of membership fee

ELFO member knows "Remuneration of 90 % of membership fee for an incumbent member, PPP of whose country is 1~33 %, and of 70%, PPP of whose country is 34~66 %." (Decision of the GA of June 22, 2021)

In this case the 90% or 70% of remuneration may be used for one's private purpose.

As there was no good reaction wishing to receive 190% of membership fee, then President Rikio Kaneko proposed:

- 1. **290% clause**, provided that it will applied to incumbent members, PPP of whose country is 1~33%
- 2. Additional aid will be adjusted as seen in the bellow table.

NB2. They may get aid from the central budget as follows:

When they succeed in inviting a person to join its national ELFA (Earth-Loving Friendly Association) or the ELFO, it can get aid, the amount of which is equivalent to the person's membership fee.

For example, supposing that a Nepali individual or organization succeeded in inviting a Diplomat, the inviting person will get remuneration of 9 \$ (because a Nepali Diplomat's membership fee is 10\$). In this case the inviting person can receive additionally 20\$ from the central ELFO budget. In all 29 &

B. Northeast Nuclear Free Zone

I, Rikio Kaneko, proposed to the ELFO General Assebly to support the draft treaty by Hiromichi Maebayashi seen in the bellow URL and to present it together with the drafter and other organizations to the States interested in this matter: A Model Treaty (peacedepot.org)

One of the the most important rules of the draft treaty is Article 3 regarding Nuclear Explosive Devices, according to which:

Each Intrazonal State (Japan, South and North Koreas) shall undertake not to conduct research on, develop, test, manufacture, produce, acquire, possess, stockpile, deploy or use any nuclear explosive device by any means, anywhere inside or outside the Northeast Asia Nuclear-Weapon-Free Zone.

C. Request of States to ratify the BWC

ELFO President Rikio Kaneko submitted to the Peace Council his PROPOSL as follows:

- 1. Our ELFO requests of non-signitory States of the 1972 Biological Weapons Convention (BWC) to be a contracting party to the BWC.
- 2. Our ELFO requests of signatory States who has not ratified the BWC to ratify it.

D. Investment in gold mine and fishery

As our member Amb. Abraham Kisembo has concession of gold mine in Africa and he proposes to invest in the gold mine, ELFO began to organize committees for them. You see ELFO President's fundamental policy which reads as follows:

- Our ELFO welcome heartily Amb. Dr. Abraham Kisembo's idea on gold mine, helping him spiritually.
 Our ELFO also welcome Mr. Ivo A. Mbongaya's
- 3. Our ELFO itself will not become a subject (actor) of these project, but cooperate with them if they want.
- 4. Our ELFO, therefore, will not be a contracting party to Memorandum of Understanding

idea especially when it seems to be profitable.

5. If it is convenient for actors of the present project, it is possible that the ELFO will be legal person.

F. Mitigation of terrorism

President PROPOSAL:

As Presindent of the ELFO, I think that it must try to find better method to mitigate harsh situation aroud terrorism and to settle problems as much as we can.

Firstly, let's try to research the relations of cause and effect of terrorism in order to approach the effective and perpetual solution of the problems.

Secondly, it is of my opinion that the ELFO should take practical action in form of 'PROPOSAL' to struggling parties if the General Assembly decides it unanimously.

G.Steps to guarantee friendship

In September 7, 2021 the ELFO adopted 2 ways to strengthen members friendship: I . admission of more friendly people and $\,$ II . dismission of unfriendly members.

I. Admission

The ELFO Charter, Article 4 was amended, new conditions for admission added:

Article 4 (Admission) 1 Membership is open to earth-loving, friendship-loving, and peace-loving States, autonomies (self-governing bodies), other organization, and individuals.

As time passes by, many colorful and various members will enter our ELFO, and unfriendly speech or behavior may happen before ELFO members. The above-mentioned amendment is expected to prevent such unpleasant behavior, by restricting conditions of admission and qualification in advance.

II. Qualification Examining Comission (QEC)

- 1. The QEC will be composed by Chief of the Chief of the Council of Judicial affairs, President of the Administrative Court, and Chief of the Friendship Council.
- 2. Not only the complainant, but also any member may express one's opinion against the member who seems not to be suitable or qualified as a ELFO member.
- 3. Even if the QEC comes to reach a conclusion to dismiss a person from membership, QEC shall recommend the person to withdraw from ELFO.





Administrative Court

To stop namicable speech and behaviour

As time passes it is possible that among ELFO members happen sometimes disharmony, unfriendly speech or conflicts. So in November 10, 2021 the GA adopted my draft regarding a Statute of the Administrative Court of the ELFO (ACELFO) which reads as follows:

STATUTE OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE COURT OF THE EARTH-LOVING FRIENDLY ORGANIZATION

For the purpose of maintaining and developing our ELFO friendly and peacefully among members our Earth-Loving Friendly Organization (ELFO) adopted the following Articles of Statute of the Administrative Court of the Earth-Loving Friendship Organization (ACELFO or Court).

Article 1. Composition of the Court

The Court shall be composed of five members, who shall possess judicial experience. Only three members may sit in any particular case.

Article 2. Jurisdiction

The Court shall be competent to hear and pass judgement upon applications alleging the following matters:

- a. a member's unfriendly speech and behavior such as illustrated in an annex.
- b. non-observance of contracts of employment or appointment of members;
- c. non-observance of commercial contracts;
- d. non-observance of our Charter and rules.

Article 3. Application of norms

The Court shall apply:

a. The Charter of the Earth-Loving Friendly Organization and its detailed rules

- b. international conventions, whether general or particular, establishing rules expressly recognized by the contesting members;
- c. international custom, as evidence of a general practice accepted as law;

Article 4. Written procedure

- 1. The written proceedings shall consist of the communication to the Court and to the parties of memorials, counter-memorials and, if necessary, replies; also all papers and documents in support.
- 2. Written and oral procedure mau be conducted through the Internet.

Article 5 Costs

Unless otherwise decided by the Court, each party shall bear its own costs.

Annex in accordance with Article 2

For the purpose of maintaining and strengthen better relations and friendship among members, they shall be on friendly terms with each other, refrain from the following speech and behaviours.

- 1. A member shall not utter wild or unpolite words as for ELFO's policy or documents which were adopted by the ELFO.
- 2. A member shall never use violent or strong language as for ELFO's policy or documents which were decided unanimously by the ELFO.
- 3. Every member shall refrain from asking other members to take an important action when situation is not clear, and while the an ELFO organs is deliberating the given conflict.
- 4. Every member shall refrain from using wild or strong speech or behavior without reading pertaining ELFO rules in question and without mentioning them concretely.
